Commemorating the Museum's 40th Anniversary Exhibition

| Hiraku: An Entrance to the Art

Seven Experiments at the Shizuoka Prefectural Museum of Art

April 25 (Sat) – June 21 (Sun)

The 40th anniversary of the Shizuoka Prefectural Museum of Art marks four decades of building a collection now exceeding 2,900 works and presenting a wide range of exhibitions. For this exhibition, selected pieces from the collection—including works by Kano Tanyu, Ito Jakuchu, Paul Gauguin, Kawamura Kiyoo, Yokoyama Taikan, and Kusama Yayoi—invite visitors to explore the varied and far-reaching world of art.

NHK Sunday Museum 50th Anniversary Exhibition

July 18 (Sat) – September 27 (Sun)

A pioneering force in arts broadcasting, NHK's long-running program Sunday Museum celebrates its 50th anniversary this year. This exhibition presents outstanding works and related pieces drawn from the artists and artworks featured on the program, accompanied by rare archival footage—including familiar former guests speaking with deep affection about the artists and their work, as well as scenes of artists creating in their studios.

Kyōsai's World: The Israel Goldman Collection

October 10 (Sat) – December 6 (Sun)

Active in the final years of the Edo period and into the Meiji era, Kawanabe Kyōsai remains highly regarded in Japan and beyond. His work spans a wide range of subjects, from paintings of deities and Buddhist figures to satirical scenes, animals, and supernatural beings. Across these varied themes, his art is distinguished by exceptional technical skill and wit. This exhibition brings together selected works from one of the world's leading Kyōsai collections, including several being shown in Japan for the first time.

The Stream of Gifts to Our Museum (working title)

January 23 (Sat) – March 28 (Sun), 2027

To mark the 40th anniversary of the Shizuoka Prefectural Museum of Art—and to express appreciation for the many works donated over the years—this exhibition reflects on the museum’s collecting history through pieces acquired by donation. It includes a focused selection of works by Ishida Tetsuya, whose reputation has risen notably in recent years, along with a substantial group from the Ota Masaki Collection, which has not yet been fully presented to the public. Taken together, these works span a wide range of periods and regions, offering a clear view of the breadth of the museum’s holdings.

Collection Exhibitions

New Acquisitions

July 18 (Sat) – September 27 (Sun)

In fiscal year 2025, 42 works were added to the museum’s collection. These include nine pieces of Western art, seven works of modern Japanese painting, and 23 contemporary works received as donations, as well as two contemporary pieces purchased by the museum and one modern Japanese painting added through collection transfer. This exhibition features all of these recent acquisitions.

Masterpieces of Landscape Painting

October 10 (Sat)–December 6 (Sun)

Landscape painting is a traditional genre that was introduced to Japan from China. Rather than depicting actual places, these works present idealized scenes of mountains and waters shaped by what the painter held in mind. Artists such as Kano Tanyu, Ike Taiga, and Tani Buncho created their own visions of these landscapes. What kinds of scenes did they imagine?

Travelling Exhibition

November 6 (Fri) – November 16 (Mon)

This exhibition introduces the activities and collection of the museum to communities across Shizuoka Prefecture. This year, it is being co-organized with the Kamoe Art Center in Hamamatsu. Related programs are also planned outside the exhibition period.
